I want to thank all the volunteers (179 in 2012!), for your continuing commitment to **"make a difference"** in the camping experience of each Camp K child. Whether you're jewelry making, fishing, tailgating with the children, cleaning

the cabins between camps or participating in our fundraisers, *all* opportunities for us to serve are *equally* important to the successful vibrant life of Camp Knutson.

I appreciate so much all of your contributions toward making the 2012 season so successful. Here's to another great season in 2013. See you all at Camp K!

## NIGHT UNDER THE STARS

The Silent/Live Auction will be held indoors in the dining area, which will give us more room and the ability to set up the day before in a secure space. There will be two dining tents set up outdoors to allow us to dine together and allow more people to attend.

We were very pleased with the trial run of the Greater Giving software used last year for registration, cataloging and express check out of silent auction items. Camp Knutson has purchased the software for us to use in the future. We are excited to build on all the programming it has to offer.

We are thrilled about the counselors being involved with the program this year....just wait and see!!

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#### HELP WANTED

Are you enthusiastic, full of energy, upbeat, creative, fun to be with, willing to work long hours with very little time off from June through August and keep smiling? These are the kind of young people Kate hires every summer to work at Camp K. When camp is



over for the week and the last camper is on the bus, they have an opportunity to kick back and relax until the next group arrives. Right? Wrong! They immediately pick up brooms and dust mops and start cleaning the camp.

Seven or eight years ago Rob asked us if we would be willing to help get the camp clean and ready to go. We said yes. In the beginning we worked in all the buildings and did what ever needed to be done. Now we are responsible for just four small buildings which take us about 1 ½ hours to 2 hours per week or less if all the buildings weren't used. Usually the first two camps of the year leave on Thursday and the rest leave on Friday. Depending on the group they can leave as early as 8 AM or as late as 3 PM. We start as soon as the campers are gone.

By helping to clean we give the whole staff a little extra time to catch their breath. And they are very appreciative. I will bring the 2013 cleaning schedule to our June meeting. I encourage you to

bring your calendars and sign up to clean once or twice this summer. It is a good way for us to support Rob and the entire staff.

I am sitting on my balcony listening to the joyous laughter of the kids playing in the pool. It got me to remembering all the laughter I heard and the smiles I saw when I volunteered at Camp Knutson last summer.
